WHO IS SVA?

Student Veterans of America (SVA) is a coalition of student veterans organizations on college campuses across the United States, and is one of the most rapidly growing grassroots veterans organizations in the United States today.

Since founding in January of 2008, SVA has grown to over 170 chapters in 40 states and the District of Columbia, reflecting the widespread desire among student veterans for cohesive, national representation

SVA has three main goals:

- Develop student veterans groups on college campuses and coordinate by region between existing groups
- Connect student groups and university administrators with resources while aiding veterans transitioning into higher education through graduation
- Advocate on behalf of student veterans at the state and national level

Thousands of veterans exit military service every month only to find an overwhelming combination of emotional, financial, and cultural obstacles standing between them and a college education. SVA is dedicated to ensuring these veterans do not slip through the cracks on their journey through higher education toward a better quality of life.

WHAT ARE STUDENT VETERANS ORGANIZATIONS?

Over 520,000 veterans are currently using their education benefits. Many of these veterans have founded local student veterans organizations on college campuses to provide peer-to-peer networks for veterans attending those institutions of higher education.

Student veterans organizations coordinate a wide range of campus activities. These activities include, but are not limited to:

- Informal social meetings that serve as peer support groups
- Benefits seminars and counseling in conjunction with other organizations
- Publication of newsletters and brochures
- Local service projects and volunteer work
- Pre-professional networking

These local peer support groups are an important part of ensuring that every veteran is ultimately successful in higher education.
